

Dear Dinesan Vadakkiniyil,

With this letter, we would formally like to invite you to be on the Board of the ERC-funded research project "Egalitarianism: Forms, Processes, Comparisons" (hereafter "the Project"). The Project runs from 1 June 2014 until 1 June 2019 and you are invited to serve on the Board for the whole period. We do hope to hear from you at your earliest convenience whether you would like to accept this invitation.

Recently formed, the Egalitarianism project aims at a multi-dimensional critical approach to the issue of egalitarianism. As a concept, the notion of Egalitarianism is initially approached in the Project as that which opposes or which breaks open all that which can be conceptualized as confining, oppressive, repressive or restrictive in the cultures (or values) and socio-political orders and structures which human beings institute and live. This broad approach requires a range of subprojects that are in continuous critical dialogue with each other and the organization of the Project reflects this; Comprising one Principal Investigator (Bruce Kapferer), two full-time academic staff, two postdoctoral fellows and three PhD students – in addition to a number of affiliated researchers, guest researchers and MA and MPHIL students – the Project promises to be a vibrant, diverse and critical anthropological research project. The Project is funded by the European Research Council through its so-called Advanced Grant scheme. Formally, the Project is located at the University of Bergen and the researchers comprising the core part of it will also be located here.

We envision the Project to have Board meetings in connection with workshops, minor conferences or other events related to the Project and these will be occasions to both deal with overarching issues pertaining to the running of the project, as well as opportunities for board members to engage scholarly with the project. Timing of the meetings is not yet set but it is envisioned we would meet once to twice a year. If need be, virtual meetings by Skype can be arranged to supplement or replace ordinary board meetings. Central tasks for Board members within the Project will include

- a) overseeing the development of various parts of the Project
- b) contributing to the development of output (especially publications) from the Project

As we do not want to establish a passive Board, we would like to make it clear that we expect members to actively engage in ongoing Project research, where and if possible. In order to facilitate this, the Project has some funding available for supporting especially fieldwork and travel costs for Board members.
