Motivational talks by outstanding students and programs like WWS, SSP, and ASAP encourage innovative learning approaches. Academic support is provided for students and research scholars to participate and present papers at seminars and conferences. Students are entrusted with responsibilities in organizing academic activities to foster leadership qualities.

Subject experts and eminent personalities visit departments regularly for productive discussions. Well-equipped laboratories facilitate experimental learning in science departments. Remedial coaching is offered to average students based on their needs. Participation in outreach programs like Talent Nurture programs strengthens social conscience. ICT-enabled teaching promotes participative learning, and a full-time counselor is available to support students facing learning difficulties and emotional stress. Annual field trips to special schools and old age homes contribute to students' social development.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

The institution ensures students and parents are informed about the internal assessment process through prospectus, orientation classes, and departmental PTA meetings. Students receive a clear understanding of their course, syllabus, evaluation process, and career opportunities. Adhering to Kannur University's guidelines, the institution conducts classroom evaluations, internal tests, assignments, and projects, with transparency.

Key points of the internal assessment process:

- 1. Each department conducts internal tests based on university guidelines. Question papers are prepared confidentially, and an exam timetable is displayed in advance. Faculty share invigilation duties, seating arrangements are made, and attendance is recorded by invigilators. Special squads prevent malpractices.
- 2. Answer scripts are evaluated and promptly distributed. Marks are documented after addressing student grievances. Marks are displayed on notice boards, followed by a parents' meeting.
- 3. A retest opportunity is provided for students to improve scores, particularly for slow learners.
- 4. Students have freedom to choose assignment topics, with submissions made on time. Evaluated assignments are returned to students.
- 5. Attendance for each teaching hour is documented, with monthly records displayed for students to track.
- 6. Internal Assessment scores consider factors like attendance, assignment quality, and exam marks. Students can verify scores and address grievances. The final consolidated mark list is published.
- 7. Field trips, industrial visits, and specimen collection are monitored and externally evaluated.
- 8. Each student receives project supervision for guidance and support. Projects are evaluated externally.
- 9. Verified marks are uploaded to the university website within the stipulated time, following a four-tier verification

process involving faculty, tutors, HODs, and the Principal.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time-bound and efficient

The institution follows Kannur University's norms for conducting internal examinations, ensuring transparency and smooth operations. The Principal and Chief Superintendent of Examinations oversee the process. Question papers are prepared confidentially, and measures are in place to prevent any form of malpractice.

The Students Grievance Cell plays a crucial role in addressing concerns related to examination conduct and answer script evaluation. Students are familiarized with the internal evaluation system and its components at the beginning of each program. Grievances are initially reported to the respective teachers, tutors, HOD, and Principal. If unresolved, students can approach the Grievance Cell directly. The criteria for calculating internal marks, as prescribed by the university, are communicated in advance. Students can independently calculate their marks and cross-verify with their teacher's assessment, resulting in minimal errors.

Internal mark sheets are provided to students for verification and signature before uploading them to the university website. Parent-teacher meetings at the end of the semester evaluate students' academic progress. Notably, there have been no significant grievances regarding examinations, evaluation, or internal marks in recent years. Remedial measures are implemented to support slow learners, and opportunities for supplementary tests are offered to students with genuine reasons for low scores.

Program Outcomes (POs), Program Specific Outcomes (PSOs), and Course Outcomes (COs) represent the fundamental concepts, knowledge, and skills acquired by students upon successfully completing a specific course or program. Kannur University establishes a Board of Studies for each program, consisting of academic experts in the respective field. This Board is responsible for periodically revising the syllabus and defining the sets of POs, PSOs, and COs. At the program's inception, these outcomes are effectively communicated to students and faculty through various measures.

Kannur University maintains a website that manages academic and administrative duties, displaying the details of POs, PSOs, and COs for every course. The college website also provides accessible information on these outcomes. Orientation programs conducted by individual departments inform students about the syllabus, outcomes, and program scope. Additionally, a comprehensive college calendar is distributed, containing faculty qualifications, contact details, program outlines, rules and regulations, fees, club and committee information, and alumni details. The College has aligned its teaching, learning, and assessment strategies with its vision and mission. Each department has specific outcomes proposed for each course, which are evaluated using a common assessment system. Student progress and performance are monitored throughout the program through a structured

mechanism. Internal evaluation includes centralized examinations at the end of each semester, along with assignments, seminars, and attendance. This approach enables continuous monitoring of student progress.

Internal and model examinations follow the University calendar. Regular class tests are conducted by each department, serving as indicators of course outcomes. Two assignments per semester contribute to the internal assessment score. ICT-enabled seminars and individual/group projects assess course outcomes and learning outcomes. University-conducted formative assessments, viva-voce, and examination result analysis provide further evaluation.

Feedback from stakeholders is collected to analyze student performance and program-specific outcomes, implementing remedial measures as needed. A placement database tracks student employment status and progression. The Physical Education department ensures consistent sports performance, while the college management, IQAC, and CLMC review factors for academic excellence.

The College Discipline Committee monitors campus discipline, and initiatives like ASAP, SSP, and WWS are implemented. Communication skills, soft skills, and competitive exam coaching are provided. Ample learning resources are available through the central library, language lab, and ORICE studio. Students are encouraged to participate in exhibitions, seminars, and management fests both within and outside the college.

A system of dynamic assessment where continuous assessment of children individually and in small groups are done to assess the individual needs of scaffolding in order to indicate the cognitive process of children thus increasing their overall ability.

The Directorate of Collegiate Education conducts regular audits, verifying various documents and registers related to funds utilization. 6.4.3 - Institutional strategies for mobilization of funds and the optimal utilization of resources

The college receives both plan and non-plan funds from the state government to fulfill its academic and developmental needs. Each year, a detailed proposal is submitted to the Directorate of Collegiate Education for fund allocation. The funds are categorized under various heads such as Faculty Development, Infrastructure, Smart Classrooms, Maintenance, Field Trips, and more. Additionally, the college seeks non-plan funds for expenses like electricity, telephone charges, and IT maintenance. It follows a strategic approach by submitting a master plan to the Government of Kerala to receive funds from the Kerala Infrastructure Investment Fund Board (KIIFB). MLA and MP funds are obtained through proposals for specific developmental activities. The college also relies on CDC, PTA, and Alumni for fund mobilization. Students contribute a fixed amount during admission, which is remitted to the government and allocated back to the college along with a grant for CDC. The voluntary PTA fund collected from students supports day-to-day expenses and developmental initiatives. The alumni associations provide assistance through endowments, student activities, cultural

programs, placements, and innovative programs. Faculty members secure major and minor projects and grants from various organizations, further contributing to the college's growth. Tuition fees collected from students are remitted to the government, while examination fees are paid directly to the University. Special grants from UGC and RUSA play a crucial role in the college's advancement and digitalization efforts. The institution prioritizes solid waste management by implementing a "Green Protocol" during seminars and events. Plastic cups, straws, and flex boards are strictly prohibited, while cloth banners and degradable materials like chart papers are used for publicity. Digital slides are encouraged for exhibitions, steel and glass tumblers are used for drinks, and only steel utensils are used for food preparation. Waste like glass splinters and aluminum scraps are disposed of in an eco-friendly manner. Steel lunch boxes and water bottles are encouraged. Infrastructure maintenance and timely furniture repairs minimize solid waste. The campus has incinerators for waste disposal and separate bins for organic and non-biodegradable waste. Organic waste is converted to compost, used in the organic farm, and non-biodegradable waste is recycled through waste management initiatives. The college promotes a paperless campus through online processes and ecommunication. Liquid waste is managed through a well-structured drainage system and soak pits, while chemical solvents are treated before disposal. Groundwater is recharged, and efforts are made to reduce e-waste through regular servicing and returning unavoidable e-waste to companies. Awareness programs and documentaries educate students about e-waste dangers. The institution follows government guidelines for e-waste management, submitting reports for proper disposal through the Public Works Department (PWD).

The Brennen community believes in student-centered learning and implements innovative methods alongside traditional teaching approaches. One key innovation is the incorporation of project work into all programs, allowing students to learn experientially through independent or group projects. Field visits and industrial visits further enhance participative learning. Seminars and assignments are part of internal evaluations, promoting problem-solving and innovative skills. Some departments utilize discussions, debates, role-play, group discussions, and case studies to achieve curriculum objectives.

Open courses are introduced across teaching departments, providing students with the freedom to choose courses of their interest. Orientation programs are organized for first-year undergraduate and postgraduate students, including residential camps for specific departments like Malayalam. Motivational talks by outstanding students and programs like WWS, SSP, and ASAP encourage innovative learning approaches. Academic support is provided for students and research scholars to participate

and present papers at seminars and conferences. Students are entrusted with responsibilities in organizing academic activities to foster leadership qualities.

Subject experts and eminent personalities visit departments regularly for productive discussions. Well-equipped laboratories facilitate experimental learning in science departments. Remedial coaching is offered to average students based on their needs. Participation in outreach programs like Talent Nurture programs strengthens social conscience. ICT-enabled teaching promotes participative learning, and a full-time counselor is available to support students facing learning difficulties and emotional stress. 2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

The institution ensures students and parents are informed about the internal assessment process through prospectus, orientation classes, and departmental PTA meetings. Students receive a clear understanding of their course, syllabus, evaluation process, and career opportunities. Adhering to Kannur University's guidelines, the institution conducts classroom evaluations, internal tests, assignments, and projects, with transparency.

Key points of the internal assessment process:

1. Each department conducts internal tests based on university guidelines. Question papers are prepared

- confidentially, and an exam timetable is displayed in advance. Faculty share invigilation duties, seating arrangements are made, and attendance is recorded by invigilators. Special squads prevent malpractices.
- 2. Answer scripts are evaluated and promptly distributed. Marks are documented after addressing student grievances. Marks are displayed on notice boards, followed by a parents' meeting.
- 3. A retest opportunity is provided for students to improve scores, particularly for slow learners.
- 4. Students have freedom to choose assignment topics, with submissions made on time. Evaluated assignments are returned to students.
- 5. Attendance for each teaching hour is documented, with monthly records displayed for students to track.
- 6. Internal Assessment scores consider factors like attendance, assignment quality, and exam marks. Students can verify scores and address grievances. The final consolidated mark list is published.
- 7. Field trips, industrial visits, and specimen collection are monitored and externally evaluated.
- 8. Each student receives project supervision for guidance and support. Projects are evaluated externally.
- 9. Verified marks are uploaded to the university website within the stipulated time, following a four-tier verification process involving faculty, tutors, HODs, and the Principal.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time-bound and efficient

The institution follows Kannur University's norms for conducting internal examinations, ensuring transparency and smooth operations. The Principal and Chief Superintendent of Examinations oversee the process. Question papers are prepared confidentially, and measures are in place to prevent any form of malpractice.

The Students Grievance Cell plays a crucial role in addressing concerns related to examination conduct and answer script evaluation. Students are familiarized with the internal evaluation system and its components at the beginning of each program. Grievances are initially reported to the respective teachers, tutors, HOD, and Principal. If unresolved, students can approach the Grievance Cell directly. The criteria for calculating internal marks, as prescribed by the university, are communicated in advance. Students can independently calculate their marks and cross-verify with their teacher's assessment, resulting in minimal errors.

Internal mark sheets are provided to students for verification and signature before uploading them to the university website. Parent-teacher meetings at the end of the semester evaluate students' academic progress. Notably, there have been no significant grievances regarding examinations, evaluation, or internal marks in recent years. Remedial measures are implemented to support slow learners, and opportunities for supplementary tests are offered to students with genuine reasons for low scores.

The College has aligned its teaching, learning, and assessment strategies with its vision and mission. Each department has specific outcomes proposed for each course, which are evaluated using a common assessment system. Student progress and performance are monitored throughout the program through a structured mechanism. Internal evaluation includes centralized examinations at the end of each semester, along with assignments, seminars, and attendance. This approach enables continuous monitoring of student progress.

Internal and model examinations follow the University calendar. Regular class tests are conducted by each department, serving as indicators of course outcomes. Two assignments per semester

contribute to the internal assessment score. ICT-enabled seminars and individual/group projects assess course outcomes and learning outcomes. University-conducted formative assessments, viva-voce, and examination result analysis provide further evaluation.

Feedback from stakeholders is collected to analyze student performance and program-specific outcomes, implementing remedial measures as needed. A placement database tracks student employment status and progression. The Physical Education department ensures consistent sports performance, while the college management, IQAC, and CLMC review factors for academic excellence.

The College Discipline Committee monitors campus discipline, and initiatives like ASAP, SSP, and WWS are implemented. Communication skills, soft skills, and competitive exam coaching are provided. Ample learning resources are available through the central library, language lab, and ORICE studio. Students are encouraged to participate in exhibitions, seminars, and management fests both within and outside the college.

A system of dynamic assessment where continuous assessment of children individually and in small groups are done to assess the individual needs of scaffolding in order to indicate the cognitive process of children thus increasing their overall ability.

6.4.3 - Institutional strategies for mobilization of funds and the optimal utilization of resources

The college receives both plan and non-plan funds from the state government to fulfill its academic and developmental needs. Each year, a detailed proposal is submitted to the Directorate of Collegiate Education for fund allocation. The funds are categorized under various heads such as Faculty Development, Infrastructure, Smart Classrooms, Maintenance, Field Trips, and more. Additionally, the college seeks non-plan funds for expenses like electricity, telephone charges, and IT maintenance. It follows a strategic approach by submitting a master plan to the Government of Kerala to receive funds from the Kerala Infrastructure Investment Fund Board (KIIFB). MLA and MP funds are obtained through proposals for specific developmental activities. The college also relies on CDC, PTA, and Alumni for fund mobilization. Students contribute a fixed amount during admission, which is remitted to the government and allocated back to the college along with a grant for CDC. The voluntary PTA fund collected from students supports day-today expenses and developmental initiatives. The alumni associations provide assistance through endowments, student

The institution prioritizes solid waste management by implementing a "Green Protocol" during seminars and events. Plastic cups, straws, and flex boards are strictly prohibited, while cloth banners and degradable materials like chart papers are used for publicity. Digital slides are encouraged for exhibitions, steel and glass tumblers are used for drinks, and only steel utensils are used for food preparation. Waste like glass splinters and aluminum scraps are disposed of in an ecofriendly manner. Steel lunch boxes and water bottles are encouraged. Infrastructure maintenance and timely furniture repairs minimize solid waste. The campus has incinerators for waste disposal and separate bins for organic and nonbiodegradable waste. Organic waste is converted to compost, used in the organic farm, and non-biodegradable waste is recycled through waste management initiatives. The college promotes a paperless campus through online processes and ecommunication. Liquid waste is managed through a wellstructured drainage system and soak pits, while chemical solvents are treated before disposal. Groundwater is recharged, and efforts are made to reduce e-waste through regular servicing and returning unavoidable e-waste to companies. Awareness programs and documentaries educate students about ewaste dangers.
